# California High School Exit Examination 2007-2008

October 2007,

Dear Parents/Guardians:

All California public high school students are required by state law to satisfy the California High School Exit Examination (CAHSEE) requirement, as well as all other state and local requirements to receive a high school diploma. This graduation requirement is mandated by state law. All students, including English learners and students with disabilities, must first take the CAHSEE in the tenth grade. Students who do not pass one or both parts of the exam in tenth grade will have additional opportunities in grades eleven and twelve to retake the part(s) not passed.

#### **Testing Dates**

The CAHSEE will be administered at the school site during regular school hours on the dates specified in the table below. As required by state law, students in grade ten must take the CAHSEE during the March 11 & 12, 2008 administration. For students who are absent, a make-up administration will be offered May 6 & 7, 2008. Students will receive additional instruction, if needed, to ensure success on this exam. Grade eleven and grade twelve students who have not passed one or both parts of the CAHSEE will take the CAHSEE on November 6 & 7, 2007 and if necessary, March 21 & 22, 2008. Seniors will have an additional opportunity to take the test February 5 & 6, 2008.

### **Top 10 Questions**

#### (Re: Student Employment)

- 1. Where do I get a work permit? Your high school Career Center. You must be regularly attending school to qualify for a work permit. If you are 18 or older or have graduated you do not need a work permit.
- 2. How old do I have to be to get a work permit? Fourteen years old. (There are some exceptions for the entertainment industry and for agriculture work.)
- 3. Do I need a work permit <u>before</u> I get a job? No, but you do need one before you actually start work. <u>After</u> you are hired, pick up the application in the Career Center. Fill out the student information section, have the employer sign and fill out his/her section and get a parent or guardian's signature. Return the completed form to the Career Center before school; the actual permit will be ready after school that same day. The work permit is then taken to the employer, who will keep it on file.
- 4. I'm 16 (or 17); how late can I work?
  10 PM when you have school the next day and 12:30 AM on any day preceding a non-school day.
- 5. *I'm 14 (or 15); how late can I work?*7 PM during the school year and 9 PM during summer vacation.
- How many hours a day can I work during the school year?
   14 and 15 years old—3 hours per day, for a maximum of 18 hours per week
   16 and 17 years old—4 hours per day, for a maximum of 28 hours per week
- How many hours a day can I work during summer vacation?
   8 hours per day, 40 hours per week
- 8. If I change jobs, do I need a new work permit? Yes.
- Where can I get more information about labor laws, (break times, tips, overtime pay, reporting time pay, etc.)?

- 10. *How long is the work permit valid?* All work permits expire in September and must be renewed at the start of each school year.

#### A.S.V.A.B.

#### (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery is a must for students planning to join the military. The results of the ASVAB can be used as qualifying scores for entrance into the military services if the scores are no more than two years old. (The scores of a student in grade 10 may not be used for enlistment purposes.) The test includes sections on mathematics, word knowledge, paragraph comprehension, mechanical comprehension, electronics, etc. It will be offered only once at our school during this school year. The date is set for Wednesday, November 14<sup>th</sup> at 7:50 AM to 11:00 AM in the library. If the student wants to take this test he or she needs to sign up in the Career Center (room 4) by November 9<sup>th</sup>.
