
Student Support Personnel Team



This diverse group is united in its goal to create and implement a support system that assists *all* students in their efforts to reach their full potential. The team boasts more than 475 years of accumulated educational experience. Certificated team members hold credentials and degrees (in many cases, advanced degrees) appropriate to the professional duties they perform; classified members receive training consistent with their job functions. Your school counselors assist in the design, coordination, implementation and evaluation of an equitable student support system.

School Climate and Safety


Your SSPT is committed to fostering an academically challenging environment that is safe, secure and welcoming. Our most recent Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) accreditation noted, as an area of strength, "a positive atmosphere on campus created by staff and students who genuinely respect and like each other." Before the school year begins, all incoming freshmen are linked with trained upper-class mentors (Link Crew Leaders) who orient their "links" to our Bulldog culture and assist them in the transition from middle school to high school. Later in the year, students have the opportunity to participate in Breaking Down the Walls (BDTW), a powerful program that creates an environment conducive to self-reflection, conflict resolution and community building. In addition, team members work closely with the Vacaville Police Department, Youth Round Table and the Youth Takin' on Tobacco and Other Drugs (YTOT) peer education program to enhance and complement our school programs. Our comprehensive School Safety Plan outlines procedures and policies for assuring the safety of all students. Student Support Personnel Team members were instrumental in the creation of the School Safety Plan, and they update the document yearly. The plan is reviewed by the School Safety Committee and is submitted to the Board of Education for adoption.







Student Results






Personal/Social Domain

Counselors directly contribute to increases in Academic Performance Index (API) scores by appropriately placing students, monitoring their progress, conferencing with struggling students and intervening when appropriate.

Team members actively promote participation in extracurricular activities and in many cases recruit participants and serve as advisors/coaches for these groups.

Counselors disseminate information through classroom presentations and assist students in their efforts to acquire local, state and federal scholarships and/or financial assistance.

Major Achievements

Your Vacaville High School SSPT is proud of its efforts to design and implement programs to support student success. Some selected major achievements with which your team played an essential role include:

- Yearlong Career/College Fair- weekly college and career presentations occur in our Career Center
- Career Center Website- newly created site includes links to colleges, career guidance, labor laws, vocational and trade schools, military options, financial aid/scholarships, test preparation and job placement
- Link Crew Program- trains and utilizes more than 100 student mentors to orient and transition freshmen into VHS
- **STAR Committee** motivates students to succeed on STAR exams through its "STAR Countdown" and STAR assemblies
- New Administrative Position Dean of Learning Support focuses attention on barriers to student success
- S.P.A.R.C.- your SSPT publishes its first SPARC

Measurements

Your SSPT utilizes a variety of assessment tools, survey results and other measurements to determine the needs and interests of our students in the academic, career and personal/social domains. These measurements assist the team in evaluating, managing and customizing our support efforts for the benefit of Vacaville High School students.

ACADEMIC:

- * College Entrance Examinations (PSAT/SAT/ACT)/Advanced Placement Tests (AP)- These tests for four-year college bound students are critical to our college counseling program.
- **CELDT** (California English Language Development Test)- This assessment helps determine the appropriate placement for students with limited English skills.
- Special Education Assessments- The school psychologist coordinates a series of assessments leading to the development of Individualized Educational Plans for students with special needs.
- California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE)- Passage of this test, administered to the sophomore class, is required for graduation. Test results are used to guide our efforts at program improvement.
- **Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR)** This test is administered to grades nine through eleven. The data generated from this exam (along with data from the CAHSEE) is disaggregated and used to determine appropriate student placement and/or the need for academic intervention.

CAREER:

- Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB)- Students considering both military and non-military careers receive valuable interest and aptitude information.
- **COIN 3-** This computer-based assessment generates useful career and occupational information.
- Senior Exit Survey- This survey collects data regarding college and career plans of graduating students. Information about student perceptions of their preparedness for the future is also collected and analyzed.

PERSONAL/SOCIAL:

- California Healthy Kids Survey- This survey assesses a variety of personal and social issues for our ninth and eleventh grade students.
- **Health Screenings-** School nurses conduct health screenings to identify health barriers to academic success and to provide services and referrals.

Community Partnerships/Resources

It's been said that "It takes a village to raise a child." Your Student Support Personnel Team believes "It takes a community to educate a student." To that end, the team collaborates and partners with a variety of individuals, organizations and agencies in our local community and beyond in our efforts to provide a well-rounded support program to all students.
